Happy New Year - 2025!

RCORUA was successful in 2024 in maintaining existing trail networks and road access points through the efforts of 23 volunteers who reported 319 hours of volunteer time (3,274 travel miles to and from projects). The two wind events gave us the opportunity to clear a number of them twice!! We knew there was a lot of work done by members and the public that wasn't submitted as volunteer hours, so thanks for that and we encourage everyone to report those hours through RCORUA. We continued the Mud Creek Project on the West Fork Ranger District, primarily with sign design and construction (by Trapper Creek Job Corps) through a MT Fish and Wildlife Trail Stewardship Program grant. We will be able to place the sign boards with maps once gates are open in 2025. Fire activity interfered with trail clearing activities this year, but we anticipate some early workdays as soon as we have access in 2025.

Announcements will be made for workdays and group rides once RCORCUA meetings resume. The first General Meeting will be held on March 10th, the time and place to be announced. This year, we will have a website in addition to the Facebook page. We'll roll that out as soon as possible; it is in the design stage. We anticipate monthly meetings as well as 6 group rides, each Board/Officer member is hosting one. They will be decided by the March meeting and posted on the web page and Facebook.

We have applied for a grant from Yamaha to reconstruct the Warm Springs Ridge Trail. If we aren't successful with Yamaha, we will try other grant avenues. We also continue to work on a comprehensive mapping product that can be used by visitors and locals alike. It will showcase our riding opportunities in Ravalli County as well as show connectors to adjacent forests and roads that link up. We started this last winter, but fires intervened in the mapping work with GIS specialists. We are pretty far along with the final product and will have maps at FS offices, local businesses, and areas where visitors can scan a QR link and access geolocated maps (likely through Avenza).

RCORUA assisted the Bitterroot National Forest in developing an OHV Master Plan which ties into a Forest Recreation Plan. This Plan guides the OHV program forward since completion of the Travel Management Plan in 2016. The OHV Master Plan is a living document that will be updated over time as projects are completed. It shows existing areas available for OHV riding, those in the implementation phase, and suggested new routes. This overall plan will assist in securing grant funding for future project opportunities, and was used for the FWP grant for Mud Creek. It will be updated over time (it is not a NEPA related decision, more a program of work).

The 2024 Volunteer Report is attached, and a big thank you goes to all who participated in maintaining existing trails and coordinating a Fun Run on the Darby Trails in August. Many thanks to our Business Sponsors who donated items for the raffle, provided space for the event, cooked/provided food, and contributed their time. It's all about the teamwork to accomplish these projects/rides, including hard work and a willing attitude. The Bitterroot National Forest supports the development of trail networks that can be utilized by <50" OHVs and incorporating newer >50" machines. We have discussed the desire to incorporate wider trails for newer machines, and this will be considered in future projects. The goal remains to provide access to trail systems off well-traveled higher speed roadways and forest roads. As we close out the 2024 Financial Report with the Bitterroot National Forest under the Challenge Cost Share Agreement, we have valued our contribution at \$14,014. The Forest Service budget is experiencing cuts and we hope to have a financial match for our work in 2025, but that is unknown at this time. We will nevertheless provide support as we have in the past and maintain the roads and trails that are on our National Forest System lands.
